Green Construction Code Training (Dave Epley)

- DCRA conducted 3 full days of mandatory training for staff and 3rd party last Fall
- Also supporting energy code training, and will be continuing in 2014 with more trainings
- Patty suggested the idea of targeting champions in the community with leadership training
- Some other possibilities ANCs, BIDs, AIA, ASHRAE, IES Chapter, ABC, Unions, IFMA
- Anica suggested having a regular schedule for trainings (like once a month)
- Dave discussed the Green Building Program Manual and its release
- Patty suggested the idea of having a professional video made for training & poster display
- Cliff said that he would tweet the webpage
- Patty suggested outreach to Home Depot, Lowes, Hardware stores

Green Construction Code Transition Plan (Dave Epley & Bill Updike)

- Dave provided a background of the Green Code Transition Task Force
- Dave discussed the process for updating of civil infractions for green code compliance
- Patty discussed the need for context and a strategic lens
- Anica mentioned the idea of coordinating with surrounding jurisdictions (Bill discussed that some of this is happening at on the green code level)
- Cliff discussed the election and the political reality of the transition on moving anything forward now and recommended outreach to CM Bowser and CM Catania (for the private sector members of GBAC)
- Brendan discussed that the budget approval process was also moving
- Anica discussed the idea of having a strawman
- Sam talked about pricing carbon and pushing the idea with the current Mayor

Grant Program for FY15 (Dave Epley & Bill Updike)

- Patty discussed the multi-year projects and plans for those
- Anica suggested collaborating with UDC Architectural Research Institute
- Marshall discussed the current benchmarking grant and possible need for further research
- Cliff discussed the idea of doing QA on energy models for code compliance (and Dave talked about what DCRA is currently doing on this subject)
- Cliff talked about COMNET

Benchmarking Update (Marshall)

- 1450 buildings were required to report April 1, currently getting 58% compliance for 2013 (83% for the 2012 reporting requirements)
- A lot of properties are still waiting on meter data from Pepco (DDOE allowed partial reporting for this reason)
- 163 buildings processed
- There were 3% gains in energy efficiency in private sector buildings in multi-year reporting
- On 2/24/14, data was publically published on 490 buildings (more data than NYC per building)— eventually the data will be posted on buildsmartdc.com sometime this summer)
- Data has received some positive press
- Committee hearing held on 4/3/14 to discuss changes to benchmarking
- Have received 37 exemption requests—most were either too narrow vacancy requirements, and one exemption request from a religious institution (Marshall is working to resolve)

 - Langston Project received 7 scenarios (district biogas fuel cell, PV/GSHP, PV & upgrades, etc.). In a holding state right now as decisions need to be made. Are presenting to OCA to push forward.
