



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3.1 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Site was historically a U.S. Government military reservation. The existing buildings were constructed by 1949 and were vacated by the military by 1988. The specific military uses are unknown; however, the Site has reportedly been abandoned since 1988. Southwest Church of Christ reportedly purchased the property in 2007, with plans to erect a church.

3.1.1 City Directories

Historical city directories dated 1922 to 2012 (in approximate five-year intervals) were reviewed and provided by EDR. The Site was listed in one directory, listed in the following:

Smitty Durham (2000)

The listed name is likely a previous property owner, since the property was a vacant government facility in 2000, based on the review of Sanborn maps (Section 3.1.3).

Based on the City Directory Abstract, residential properties and a school (adjacent to the west) have historically been located in the area.

3.1.2 Aerial Photographs

Aerial photographs frequently provide visual documentation of site conditions at the time of the photographs. Activities such as dumping or industrial use of a site can often be discerned through the examination of aerial photographs.

IVI reviewed historic aerial photographs provided by the EDR. The following is a synopsis of the aerial photographs reviewed:

3.1.3 Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps

IVI reviewed Sanborn Maps for the Site area provided by EDR. The findings of this review are summarized in the following table:

3.1.4 Topographic Maps

IVI reviewed historic USGS West Washington, Mount Vernon, Washington & Vicinity and Alexandria, Virginia topographic maps of the Site area provided by EDR. A summary of the topographic map review is provided in the following table:

3.2 HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANT OR ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS

The Site was historically a U.S. Government military reservation. The existing buildings were constructed by 1949 and were vacated by the military by 1988. The Site has been unoccupied since that time.

Former storage tanks were associated with the prior use and are discussed in Section 6.2.

Appendix VIII - Future Property Use

Future Use of Property

The Bright Beginnings Southeast Child and Family Development Center will provide 100 homeless infants and toddlers (ages six weeks to 36 months) high quality and developmentally appropriate early education, along with therapeutic services for developmental delays that are prevalent among homeless children due to poor health, poor nutrition, and unstable home environments. Diagnosed delays are addressed on-site by experts in speech/language, motor skill, and child psychology. The new center will also serve the children's parents.

At Bright Beginnings, the average parent is a 27 year-old, African American single mother with three children, living in an emergency shelter. The median family income is \$700 per month, including food stamps. Parents are the most important people in the lives of a young child, so Bright Beginnings focuses considerable attention on the needs of the parents for family stabilization services, including parenting guidance, assistance in identifying and securing housing and educational attainment, and workforce development. Bright Beginnings presently serves almost 150 young children a year through its center in Ward One. It operates at full capacity, serving its clients five days a week year round from 7:30 am to 11:30 pm. All services are free of charge.

Bright Beginnings has a waiting list of over 200 children. With the opening of a second center, BB will serve an additional 100 children and their families. The project brings services closer to the most underserved ward of the District of Columbia and the second center will be in the heart of the highest concentration of Bright Beginnings' waitlisted children.

December 2015 - Ground breaking ceremony

February to October 2016 – Construction

November 2016 - Grand Opening

December 2016 – Enroll families up to 48 children for year one and gradually work up to 100 children in 2021



IVI Assessment Services, Inc. ("IVI") is pleased to submit the findings, conclusions and recommendations from our Phase I ESA report dated October 8, 2013 of the above-referenced property.

The Bright Beginnings, Inc. property is located at 3418 4th Street SE, in Washington, D.C. 20032 (the "Site"). The Site consists of 1.325 acres of land improved with two former military buildings, approximately 2,800 square feet (Building A) and 1,200 square feet (Building B) in size, on the southern portion of the Site. In addition, an auxiliary building is located on the northern portion of the Site. All of the on-site buildings have been abandoned for over 25 years. The remaining portions of the Site consist of vacant grass/undeveloped land with antennae and wood poles. The Site is located southeast of the intersection of 4th Street and Trenton Streets in an area known as "Congress Heights". The Site is situated in a residential area.

The Site was historically a U.S. Government military reservation. The existing buildings were reportedly constructed by 1949 and were vacated by the military by 1988. The Site has reportedly been unoccupied since that time. It was noted that the property is currently owned by the Southwest Church of Christ, who is selling the land to Bright Beginnings, Inc., who intends to demolish the existing buildings and construct a building to provide Head Start and Pre-Head Start programs for homeless children.



Phase I ESA Bright Beginnings Inc.

IVI observed evidence of a potential UST in the vicinity of Building A. A vent pipe riser was observed on the exterior of the building. No fill port was observed in the vicinity of the vent pipe or surrounding areas. Evidence of former USTs was not observed in the vicinity of the other on-site structures.

According to an interview with a current owner representative, UST(s) were previously maintained on-site; however, although requested, copies of previous site investigations were not provided for our review. It was also noted that an aboveground storage tank (AST) was previously located inside Building A. Of note, the Site was not identified on the District's list of registered UST or Permitted AST facilities.

Several off-site properties in were identified during IVI's regulatory database. Notwithstanding, given a variety of factors including intervening distance, presumed groundwater flow, and/or regulatory status, these off-site properties are not suspected to represent a REC.

Based on the building construction date of the on-site buildings the potential on-site use of asbestos-containing materials and lead-based paint exists.

FINDINGS, OPINIONS, CONCLUSIONS

This assessment has revealed no evidence of recognized environmental conditions (RECs) in connection with the Site; except for the following:

Former Underground Storage Tanks (USTs)

IVI observed a vent pipe riser, typical of petroleum storage tanks, on the south exterior of Building A. No fill port was observed in the vicinity of the vent pipe or surrounding areas. Based on observations (i.e., orientation of vent pipe, no fill pipe protruding from a wall), it is likely that the vent pipe is associated with a UST. Neither a vent pipe nor fill pipe were observed in the vicinity of Building B. However, it should be noted that dense, overgrown vegetation was present along the exterior of the buildings and a steep slope was located on the southern side of Building B.

According to Ms. Joan Rajah of the Southwest Church of Christ (the current property owner), a prior property assessment was conducted by a past potential purchaser (Valor Group), which revealed the presence of USTs. However, Ms. Rajah stated that that she had no knowledge of UST removals from the Site. In addition, Ms. Rajah reported that an AST was previously located inside Building A, possibly for heating oil. Ms. Rajah did not have copies of previous environmental investigations; however, a geotechnical investigation, dated 2008, was provided. This report did not reveal evidence of environmental concerns; however, soil and groundwater were not analyzed for contaminants.

Of note, the Site was not identified on the District's list of registered UST or Permitted AST facilities. Based on the construction date of the buildings (by 1949), the absence of

regulations at the time of storage tank use, the lack of information regarding the potential tanks (e.g., if removal/closure occurred, tank integrity, etc.) and subsurface conditions, the former storage tanks are considered to be a REC.

In addition, IVI identified the following business environmental risks (BERs):

Asbestos-Containing Materials (ACMs)

Based on the construction date of the on-site buildings, the potential for ACM exists. Interior finishes and materials that may contain asbestos include plasters/drywall, floor tile, mastics, textured ceilings, dropped ceiling tile, and roofing materials. IVI did not have access inside the buildings. The current owner was not aware of any identified ACMs; however, stated that based on a prior roof contractor's inspection, the buildings' roofs may contain asbestos.

Lead-Based Paint (LBP)

Based on the construction date of the on-site buildings, the potential for LBP exists. As previously reported, IVI did not have access inside the buildings. The current owner was not aware of any identified LBP. Significant peeling/flaking paint was not observed on the exterior of the buildings.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Former Underground Storage Tanks (USTs)

Given the level of uncertainty regarding the presence of potential USTs on-site, IVI recommends conducting a Phase II ESA to determine if USTs remain on-site and to determine if soil and groundwater has been impacted by previously undocumented releases. If tanks remain on the property, they should be properly removed prior to redevelopment of the Site.

Asbestos-Containing Materials (ACMs)

Prior to building renovation and/or demolition activities, that require the removal or disturbance of suspect ACMs, IVI recommends that they be characterized for asbestos and properly handled and/or abated. All activities involving ACM should be conducted in accordance with governmental regulations.

Lead-Based Paint (LBP)

Prior to future building renovation and/or demolition which requires the removal or disturbance of any suspect LBP, these materials should be characterized for lead by a reliable method and, if necessary, properly abated in accordance with all applicable regulations regarding lead.

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Froehling & Robertson, Inc. (F&R) has completed a Limited Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (Phase II) in general conformance with the scope and limitations contained in F&R Proposal Number 1472-3127E of Bright Beginnings Inc., a developed parcel of land located at 3418 4th Street, SE, Washington, D.C. The following is a summary of our findings and is not intended to replace more detailed information contained elsewhere in this report:

The Site consists of an triangular shaped parcel of land and developed with two (2) 2,800 square foot former military buildings constructed in 1949. The Site also contains asphalt parking and drive lanes and grassy/wooded areas.

One (1) suspect UST was identified using ground penetrating radar (GPR) located on the Site to the south of Building A. After obtaining the required permits from the District of Columba, three (3) soil borings were advanced at the site and soil and groundwater was collected. Based on laboratory analysis the following analytes exceeded the District Department of the Environment risk based corrective action levels for groundwater and soil: TPH-DRO, Ethylbenzene and xylenes.

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Previously Identified Concerns

Based on previous environmental investigations provided to F&R, potential areas that may contain USTs were identified at the Site.

2.2 Scope of Services

F&R's scope of service included collecting soil and water samples at the Property for chemical analyses. Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) was utilized to identify potential UST areas. Borings were located in the areas of concern at the Site based on the identified concerns. A GeoProbe® was used to install three (3) borings and soil cores were recovered continuously throughout the length of the borings. Borings were extended up to 27.5 feet below the ground surface (ft bgs). Soil samples were screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by head space analysis. Three (3) soil samples and three (3) groundwater samples were submitted for analysis for the following parameters: benzene, toluene,



ethylbenzene, xylenes (BTEX), and total petroleum hydrocarbons diesel range organics (TPH DRO) in accordance with EPA Methods 8260B and 8015MB.

3.0 SITE SURVEY

Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR)

F&R mobilized to the Site on December 3, 2013 to conduct ground penetrating radar (GPR) survey to attempt to locate underground utilities and former UST locations. A Geophysical Survey Systems Inc. (GSSI) SIR-3000 Radar unit was used. The survey results and data were interpreted in real time. Scans were performed two (2) feet apart using the SIR-3000 with a 400MHz antenna to locate utilities beneath the surface within the pre-designated area. This process consisted of running scans in a grid pattern to check for items in all directions. When scanning for utilities a signal is sent into the subsurface and reflects back in a hyperbola showing the top of utilities. The 400MHz was able to read to a depth of five (5) to six (6) feet below ground surface (bgs). Identified utilities were marked prior to conducting the borings.

The results of the GPR survey did detect anomalies indicative of a UST on the Property. Specifically, one area to the south of the northern building (Building A) is suspected to contain UST. Borings were adjusted based on the anomalies. Please refer to the Boring Location Map located in Appendix C.

4.0 SOIL SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS

F&R mobilized to the Site on December 6, 2013, to conduct sampling activities. Three (3) soil borings were advanced using direct push technology labeled SB-1 through SB-3. Boring locations were selected based on GPR survey and field conditions such as utilities and subsurface features. Boring SB-1 was advanced to the southwest of the suspected UST location behind building A. SB-2 and SB-3 were advanced to the southwest and southeast of SB-1, respectively.

Soil borings were screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) via head space analysis. Soil from each 4 foot sampling depth was placed in a plastic bag and allowed to volatize for approximately 10 minutes after which time the PID was used to screen for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in the soil samples.

Approximately one foot of soil from each boring was collected for the samples submitted. Groundwater samples were collected from SB-1 through SB-3. The soil borings were advanced to depths of 27.0 - 27.5 ft bgs.

Subsurface soils consisted of brown/tan silt with sand grading to a red/brown silty sand with



depth. Bedrock refusal was not encountered in any of the three borings. One soil sample was collected from each boring and submitted for laboratory analysis. A petroleum odor was observed in SB-1 at 6 to 12- ft bgs, a soil sample was collected at that depth. No other noticeable odors were observed and therefore, all other soil samples consisted of the soil at the boring termination.

The samples were collected, placed in appropriate pre-labeled sample containers and transported to Maryland Spectral Services located in Baltimore, Maryland under chain of custody protocol for analysis. Soil and groundwater samples from SB-1, SB-2, and SB-3 were analyzed for benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, xylenes (BTEX), and total petroleum hydrocarbons diesel range organics (TPH DRO) in accordance with EPA Methods 8260B and 8015MB. Please refer to the Sample Location Map for the boring locations.

5.0 CONCLUSIONS

Three (3) soil borings were advanced at various locations at the site. Based on laboratory analysis the following analytes exceeded the District Department of the Environment Risk based corrective action levels for groundwater and soil: TPH-DRO, Ethylbenzene and xylenes. Additionally, one UST is suspected to be located on the Site to the south of Building A.

The proposed work will be conducted on the southern portion of the Property. Locations of the borings are depicted on the attached Site Location Map. This Work Plan will define the following: locations of subsurface borings, soil sampling procedures, and backfilling procedures.

3.0 Site Details

3.1 Site Description

The Site is located southeast of the intersection between 4th street and Trenton Street, SE. The test borings will be conducted on the southern portion of the Property. The southern portion of the Property consists of two buildings surrounded by grass and wooded areas. The southern portion of the Property is generally flat.



3.2 Site Geology

The site is expected to be underlain by fill materials and unconsolidated coastal plain deposits.

4.0 Proposed Subsurface Investigation

4.1 Exploration Goals

The purpose of this site investigation is to determine whether contamination is present in the soils and groundwater beneath the Site. This information will be used to determine whether the Property has been impacted by the Site's past uses.

4.2 Soil Investigation Activities

Three (3) soil borings, identified as SB-1, SB-2, and SB-3, are proposed to evaluate the subsurface conditions at the Site. F&R will advance the soil borings to groundwater depth or refusal, whichever occurs first, utilizing two inch diameter direct push drilling technology. Soil cores will be collected continuously. During the advancement of the borings, soil samples will be screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by head space analysis. Soil samples will be taken from either the terminal depth of the boring or at a depth where obvious indicators of contamination are present. Three (3) soil samples and up to three groundwater samples will be collected. Groundwater samples will be obtained with a polytube or peristaltic pump. Please refer to the attached Site Location Map for specific site and boring locations.

4.3 Investigative-Derived Waste Management

All Investigation-derived waste (IDW) due to well construction, operation, maintenance or abandonment from the site will be containerized and laboratory tested for off-site disposal. The test borings will be backfilled with bentonite slurry (2:1, 2 pounds bentonite to 1 gallon water ratio) immediately upon completion. The bentonite slurry will be placed in the test borings from the bottom up to the surface with a tremie pipe. Test borings conducted within existing paved area will be patched with asphalt "cold" patch and/or concrete patch, whichever is appropriate.

Miss Utility will be notified a minimum of 72 hours in advance of planned drilling activities to clear the proposed boring locations. Drilling will commence at the Site within 5 working days of utility clearance.

4.5 Quality Control/Assurance

Quality assurance and quality control (QA/QC) of the field work will be performed in accordance with F&R's Environmental Standard Operating Procedures for Field Instrumentation, Sampling and Equipment Decontamination. There is no evidence of contamination on site. Therefore, we will not conduct decontamination procedures on the equipment unless necessary. If it is found that the site is contaminated, drilling operations will cease and a decontamination plan will be established and implemented and all cleaning fluid will be containerized. All sampling equipment to be decontaminated using an alconox solution and rinse between sampling intervals. GeoProbe equipment and sampling tools will be decontaminated using same procedure between holes.

Directions: Make up cleaning solution as in mixing directions, or use undiluted detergent on a warm, wet cloth or sponge for non-abrasive scouring. Clean as follows:

- · Wet the article with solution by dunking or using a soaked cloth or sponge.
- Clean with a cloth, sponge, cotton swab, brush or pad that agitates surface soils without marring the surface.
- Rinse thoroughly with distilled water for at least 10 seconds. Wear gloves/eye protection.

5.0 Anticipated Schedule

Drilling activities are scheduled to occur after the DDOE permit has been received. DDOE will be notified of the scheduled date after these permits are approved. The current planned date is November 20, 2013.





1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Froehling & Robertson, Inc. (F&R) has completed a Limited Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (Phase II) in general conformance with the scope and limitations contained in F&R Proposal Number 1472-3127E of Bright Beginnings Inc., a developed parcel of land located at 3418 4th Street, SE, Washington, D.C. The following is a summary of our findings and is not intended to replace more detailed information contained elsewhere in this report:

The Site consists of an triangular shaped parcel of land and developed with two (2) 2,800 square foot former military buildings constructed in 1949. The Site also contains asphalt parking and drive lanes and grassy/wooded areas.

One (1) suspect UST was identified using ground penetrating radar (GPR) located on the Site to the south of Building A. After obtaining the required permits from the District of Columba, three (3) soil borings were advanced at the site and soil and groundwater was collected. Based on laboratory analysis the following analytes exceeded the District Department of the Environment risk based corrective action levels for groundwater and soil: TPH-DRO, Ethylbenzene and xylenes.

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Previously Identified Concerns

Based on previous environmental investigations provided to F&R, potential areas that may contain USTs were identified at the Site.

2.2 Scope of Services

F&R's scope of service included collecting soil and water samples at the Property for chemical analyses. Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) was utilized to identify potential UST areas. Borings were located in the areas of concern at the Site based on the identified concerns. A GeoProbe® was used to install three (3) borings and soil cores were recovered continuously throughout the length of the borings. Borings were extended up to 27.5 feet below the ground surface (ft bgs). Soil samples were screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by head space analysis. Three (3) soil samples and three (3) groundwater samples were submitted for analysis for the following parameters: benzene, toluene,



ethylbenzene, xylenes (BTEX), and total petroleum hydrocarbons diesel range organics (TPH DRO) in accordance with EPA Methods 8260B and 8015MB.

3.0 SITE SURVEY

Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR)

F&R mobilized to the Site on December 3, 2013 to conduct ground penetrating radar (GPR) survey to attempt to locate underground utilities and former UST locations. A Geophysical Survey Systems Inc. (GSSI) SIR-3000 Radar unit was used. The survey results and data were interpreted in real time. Scans were performed two (2) feet apart using the SIR-3000 with a 400MHz antenna to locate utilities beneath the surface within the pre-designated area. This process consisted of running scans in a grid pattern to check for items in all directions. When scanning for utilities a signal is sent into the subsurface and reflects back in a hyperbola showing the top of utilities. The 400MHz was able to read to a depth of five (5) to six (6) feet below ground surface (bgs). Identified utilities were marked prior to conducting the borings.

The results of the GPR survey did detect anomalies indicative of a UST on the Property. Specifically, one area to the south of the northern building (Building A) is suspected to contain UST. Borings were adjusted based on the anomalies. Please refer to the Boring Location Map located in Appendix C.

4.0 SOIL SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS

F&R mobilized to the Site on December 6, 2013, to conduct sampling activities. Three (3) soil borings were advanced using direct push technology labeled SB-1 through SB-3. Boring locations were selected based on GPR survey and field conditions such as utilities and subsurface features. Boring SB-1 was advanced to the southwest of the suspected UST location behind building A. SB-2 and SB-3 were advanced to the southwest and southeast of SB-1, respectively.

Soil borings were screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) via head space analysis. Soil from each 4 foot sampling depth was placed in a plastic bag and allowed to volatize for approximately 10 minutes after which time the PID was used to screen for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in the soil samples.

Approximately one foot of soil from each boring was collected for the samples submitted. Groundwater samples were collected from SB-1 through SB-3. The soil borings were advanced to depths of 27.0-27.5 ft bgs.

Subsurface soils consisted of brown/tan silt with sand grading to a red/brown silty sand with



depth. Bedrock refusal was not encountered in any of the three borings. One soil sample was collected from each boring and submitted for laboratory analysis. A petroleum odor was observed in SB-1 at 6 to 12- ft bgs, a soil sample was collected at that depth. No other noticeable odors were observed and therefore, all other soil samples consisted of the soil at the boring termination.

The samples were collected, placed in appropriate pre-labeled sample containers and transported to Maryland Spectral Services located in Baltimore, Maryland under chain of custody protocol for analysis. Soil and groundwater samples from SB-1, SB-2, and SB-3 were analyzed for benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, xylenes (BTEX), and total petroleum hydrocarbons diesel range organics (TPH DRO) in accordance with EPA Methods 8260B and 8015MB. Please refer to the Sample Location Map for the boring locations.

5.0 CONCLUSIONS

Three (3) soil borings were advanced at various locations at the site. Based on laboratory analysis the following analytes exceeded the District Department of the Environment Risk based corrective action levels for groundwater and soil: TPH-DRO, Ethylbenzene and xylenes. Additionally, one UST is suspected to be located on the Site to the south of Building A.

3.0 Site Details

3.1 Site Description

The Site is located southeast of the intersection between 4th street and Trenton Street, SE. The test borings will be conducted on the southern portion of the Property. The southern portion of the Property consists of two buildings surrounded by grass and wooded areas. The southern portion of the Property is generally flat.



3.2 Site Geology

The site is expected to be underlain by fill materials and unconsolidated coastal plain deposits.

4.0 Proposed Subsurface Investigation

4.1 Exploration Goals

The purpose of this site investigation is to determine whether contamination is present in the soils and groundwater beneath the Site. This information will be used to determine whether the Property has been impacted by the Site's past uses.

4.2 Soil Investigation Activities

Three (3) soil borings, identified as SB-1, SB-2, and SB-3, are proposed to evaluate the subsurface conditions at the Site. F&R will advance the soil borings to groundwater depth or refusal, whichever occurs first, utilizing two inch diameter direct push drilling technology. Soil cores will be collected continuously. During the advancement of the borings, soil samples will be screened in the field with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by head space analysis. Soil samples will be taken from either the terminal depth of the boring or at a depth where obvious indicators of contamination are present. Three (3) soil samples and up to three groundwater samples will be collected. Groundwater samples will be obtained with a polytube or peristaltic pump. Please refer to the attached Site Location Map for specific site and boring locations.

4.3 Investigative-Derived Waste Management

All Investigation-derived waste (IDW) due to well construction, operation, maintenance or abandonment from the site will be containerized and laboratory tested for off-site disposal. The test borings will be backfilled with bentonite slurry (2:1, 2 pounds bentonite to 1 gallon water ratio) immediately upon completion. The bentonite slurry will be placed in the test borings from the bottom up to the surface with a tremie pipe. Test borings conducted within existing paved area will be patched with asphalt "cold" patch and/or concrete patch, whichever is appropriate.

Miss Utility will be notified a minimum of 72 hours in advance of planned drilling activities to clear the proposed boring locations. Drilling will commence at the Site within 5 working days of utility clearance.

4.5 Quality Control/Assurance

Quality assurance and quality control (QA/QC) of the field work will be performed in accordance with F&R's Environmental Standard Operating Procedures for Field Instrumentation, Sampling and Equipment Decontamination. There is no evidence of contamination on site. Therefore, we will not conduct decontamination procedures on the equipment unless necessary. If it is found that the site is contaminated, drilling operations will cease and a decontamination plan will be established and implemented and all cleaning fluid will be containerized. All sampling equipment to be decontaminated using an alconox solution and rinse between sampling intervals. GeoProbe equipment and sampling tools will be decontaminated using same procedure between holes.

Directions: Make up cleaning solution as in mixing directions, or use undiluted detergent on a warm, wet cloth or sponge for non-abrasive scouring. Clean as follows:

- Wet the article with solution by dunking or using a soaked cloth or sponge.
- Clean with a cloth, sponge, cotton swab, brush or pad that agitates surface soils without marring the surface.
- Rinse thoroughly with distilled water for at least 10 seconds. Wear gloves/eye protection.

5.0 Anticipated Schedule

Drilling activities are scheduled to occur after the DDOE permit has been received. DDOE will be notified of the scheduled date after these permits are approved. The current planned date is November 20, 2013.





Whereas, the overall presentation and the information presented demonstrate to ANC 8C that approval of the project will have a significant positive impact on the development of the community, particularly given Bright Beginnings' commitment to providing public benefits to the community, given the burgeoning homeless population.




