## STORMWATER POLLUTION

Anything other than stormwater

- Dirt
  - Trash
- Wash water and soaps Salt and Brine
- Vehicle and equipment fluids
- Pesticides and fertilizers
- Paints and solvents

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OIL

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- Rust
- Pet waste

## DISTRICT-WIDE REGULATIONS

- 1. Slow it Down
- 2. Reduce Major Pollutants
  - Pesticides
  - Fertilizer
  - Coal Tar
  - Litter



## 2013 STORMWATER REGULATIONS

New buildings and major renovations are required to install Best Management Practices (BMPs)

**Stormwater Management Plan** is like a Maintenance Agreement





#### **Common Best Management Practices**













## OFF-SITE COMPLIANCE

- Why Comply Off-Site
  - Increases site design flexibility
  - Use space on site for other amenities
- Who's Eligible?
  - Any property that triggers the 2013
     Stormwater Rule can comply 50% off-site
  - DOEE has proposed to increase off-site flexibility to 100% for projects that drain to CSS storage tunnels
- What's Required?
  - Use Stormwater Retention Credits or Pay an In-lieu Fee annually

#### BMPs must be regularly maintained and inspected

- Owner responsibility
- Self-inspections and regulatory inspections

#### How?

- 1. Follow Stormwater Management Plan
- 2. Check with manufacturer
- 3. Use DOEE Stormwater Guidebook doee.dc.gov/swguidebook







## SELF-INSPECTION SELF-REPORTING

- Online, self-reporting tool for top performers
- Report, track, share, and store inspection and maintenance records
- Being piloted

## EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL (ESC)

Any project that disturbs more than 50 square feet of land must submit an ESC plan to DOEE before starting the project

#### PESTICIDES

- Herbicides, rodenticides, insecticides, fungicides, and others
- Applicator must be licensed in the District of Columbia and follow District guidelines
- Encourage Integrated Pest Management

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Applies to professionals treating turf If using fertilizer:

- No Phosphorous (P)
  - unless soil test shows need
- Nitrogen (N) must be at least 20% slow release applied using these rates:
  - <0.7 lbs per 1,000 ft<sup>2</sup> if water-soluble
  - <0.9 lbs per 1,000 ft<sup>2</sup> of total nitrogen
- Follow best management practices

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## FERTILIZERS (cont.)

#### Do not apply fertilizer:

- 1. Between November 15 and March 1
- 2. Within 15 feet of a waterbody
- 3. When it is raining, 24 hours before it is expected to rain, if soil is saturated, or if ground is frozen
- 4. In excess of the legal rate found online:

## COAL & HIGH-PAH SEALANT BAN

Illegal to sell, use, or permit the use of coal tar and other high-PAH pavement products

- Coal tar contains high levels of PAHs
  - toxic and known carcinogens
- Commonly used to seal and beautify parking lots and driveways
- Fine up to \$2,500 per day

## LITTER & ILLEGAL DUMPING

- 1. Use a licensed hauler
  - <u>eservices.dcra.dc.gov/BBLV/Default.aspx</u>
- 2. Pick up litter from property and public space

## TWO TYPES OF SEWERS

**2/3** of the District flows directly into local waterways with little to no treatment

- 1. Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)
- 2. Combined Sewer System (CSS)

#### CLEAN WATER ACT

1972

- Protects waterways from pollution
  - Regulates illicit discharges
  - Sets water quality standards

#### National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) – Permitting system





## ILLICIT DISCHARGES

## Illegal Emissions

The act of allowing material other than stormwater to get into the storm sewer system

#### Types:

- Misconnected or leaking sewer lines
- Materials poured or swept into stormdrains
- Dumpster juice
- Wash water

# UNITED STATES

### **NPDES Permits in the District:**

1. Individual Permits:

IN THE MS4

- Sewer Systems: DC Water, District of Columbia
- Large Facilities: JBAB, NPS, DCA, et al.
- 2. Multi-Sector General Permit (MSGP) for industrial activity
- 3. Construction General Permit for projects >1 acre

#### Drivers License for Stormwater





## INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES



IN THE MS4

#### Activities that need MSGP coverage include:

- 1. Passenger transportation
- 2. Food and beverage production (resale)
- 3. Printing and publishing
- 4. Electronic, electrical, photographic, and optical goods (manufacturing)
  - ... and others

#### APPLY DIRECTLY TO EPA FOR COVERAGE www.epa.gov/npdes/stormwater-dischargesindustrial-activities





Fines range from \$2,500 to \$250,000 and imprisonment *per day per violation* 

Types of Penalties	Fines	Imprisonment
Negligent Violation	\$2,500 - \$25,000	< 1 years
Knowing Violation	\$5,000 - \$50,000	< 3 years
Knowing Endangerment	< \$250,000	< 15 years
False Statement	< \$10,000	< 6 months or < 2 years

**Other types:** Civil and Administration Penalties



#### WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT

#### Facilities in the MS4 must have a Spill Prevention and Cleanup Plan

## **GOOD HOUSEKEEPING**

















- 1. Transfer liquids inside in a parking garage or under cover
- 2. Keep fluids in secondary containment, such as in a tub while using them
- **3. Keep containers closed** when not in use
- **4. Immediately clean up** any spills or drips
- 5. Use less toxic alternatives





## OUTDOOR STORAGE

- 1. Put it away
- 2. Keep it clear of stormwater covered and elevated
- 3. Keep an eye on containers



Metal drums are rusting & dented, & boxes of material have degraded



These supplies are elevated off the ground on pallets & covered with a tarp

## WASTE

- 1. Do not dispose of liquids in the trash, recycling, or directly into the storm drain
- 2. Keep the lids on dumpsters and trash bins
- **3. Dispose of hazardous wastes**, such as batteries, at assigned collection locations



#### Clean up spills and leaks immediately

#### 1. Never use water

- Prevent the material from getting to the drain
- Cover with absorbents and scrub
- Pick/sweep up absorbents and dispose of properly

#### 2. Spill kits should be:

- Stocked
- Labeled
- Easily accessible
- Where they belong
- 3. Document all spills and leaks
  - Report them to DOEE

## **NEVER USE WATER**





## SPILL REPORTING

- Call 911 if it gets into a public storm drain or cannot be controlled
  Call 202-535-2600, Monday-Friday, 9am to 5pm
  - to report non-emergency spills and leaks





## INCENTIVES

- 1. Stormwater Retention Credits
- 2. Green Roofs
- 3. Pollination



## STORMWATER RETENTION CREDITS

- Who's Eligible?
  - Properties and SRC-aggregating businesses that voluntarily install green infrastructure

#### • What's Required?

- DOEE approved Stormwater Management Plan
- Pass DOEE inspections
- Maintenance contract/plan

#### Incentive Amount:

- Average \$1.81/SRC over the last 12 months
- Sell to DOEE at fixed rates through SRC Price Lock Program

## RIVERSMART ROOFTOPS

- Who's Eligible?
  - All District property owners
- What's Required?
  - Apply before installing green roof
- Incentive Amount: Rebate
  - \$10 per square foot (in CSS)
  - \$15 per square foot (in MS4)

#### Structural Capacity

- Building must have structural capacity to host green roof
- Structural engineering rebate available for buildings <2,500 sqft</li>

## POLLINATION

#### Voluntary Program

- 1. Plant native and non-invasive plants
- 2. Plant a mix of flowers that bloom all year and provide habitat
- 3. Minimize pesticide use

- 1. Stormwater: slow it down and stop pollution
- 2. District-wide Regulations
  - 2013 Stormwater Regulation for new builds and renovations
  - Prevent major sources Pesticides, Fertilizer Law,
     Coal Tar ban, Litter and illegal dumping
- 3. Location-specific Regulations for MS4
  - Permit for industrial facilities
  - Spill Prevention and Response Plan
- 4. Incentives
  - Stormwater Retention Credits
  - RiverSmart Rooftops
  - Pollination
