The 2017 Wetland Conservation Plan involved an immense boots-on-the-ground inventory and assessment of the District's wetlands. Functional assessments were performed to document the condition of each wetland and identify opportunities for restoration or enhancement. Additionally, potential wetland creation sites were documented and mapped.

The field data collected included wetland boundaries, plant lists, data and forms were compiled into a geodatabase called the Wetland Registry (Registry). The key layers of the Registry are illustrated on this map.

The District Wetland Registry will allow any stakeholder to:

- identify potential restoration, enhancement, and creation projects;
- identify possible wetland mitigation sites;
- have an initial idea if wetlands are present for land-planning purposes; and,
- protect our existing wetlands

The Registry will not replace the need for site-specific wetland delineations for land-use planning, development, or any other activities that may require a permit or environmental impact statement. Also, all potential wetland creation, enhancement, and restoration sites identified during field work were evaluated solely on the basis of ecological parameters and do not ensure that a project may be undertaken on any particular site. Many factors need to be investigated before initiating a wetland creation, enhancement, or restoration project.
