Questions and Answers

Q1: For the new GMS portal – should applicants create their email address first then try to register?

A1: Yes – please create the email first and then register your account.

Q2: Should applicants develop their proposals in a separate word document and then copy and paste into the GMS?

A2: Yes

Q3: Does the GMS offer the functionality to start and save work? Can an applicant start a submission and then come back to it later to complete and submit?

A3: Yes

Q4: Is there anything else an applicant needs to do before submitting a proposal in the GMS?

A4: Outside of creating a new account, no.

Q5: How should subcontractors be budgeted? What level of detail is needed?

A5: Typically the level of detail needed for subcontractors in a budget or an invoice submission is one lump sum. Supporting documentation or more details for subcontractor costs can make an application more compelling. DOEE's Grant Managers can also request more details on subcontractor costs at any time.

Q6: What is the jurisdiction of each trash trap, and are letters of support required?

A6: Letters of support are encouraged but not required. The jurisdictions are as follows:

7	Diamond Teague Trash Boom	DPR
8	James Creek Marina Bandalong	NPS-NACE

Q7: Is it necessary to upload a narrative response to each scoring criteria?

A7: Your proposal should consider and address each criteria in your application. A separate narrative to the scoring criteria is not required.
