Enhancing Green Infrastructure Community Benefits

- Q1. Can grant funds be used to cover non-construction costs involved in the installation of SRC-generating GI, such as maintenance costs etc.?
- A1. No. The grant will not fund elements of stormwater retention credit (SRC) eligible green infrastructure (GI) practices, including construction and non-construction related costs, such as maintenance. Additionally, the dollar amount of funding for a GI element proposed under this RFA cannot be included in the GI's proposal for SRC-eligible stormwater retention capacity. If applicable, projects proposed under this RFA should identify and document other sources of funding that will be used to construct, manage, and maintain stormwater retention capacity. - **A4.** Yes, grant funds can be used to provide stipends or honoraria to community members who are involved in a participatory design and/or planning process for a green infrastructure (GI) project. Projects funded under this RFA must employ a participatory process to engage the Community.
