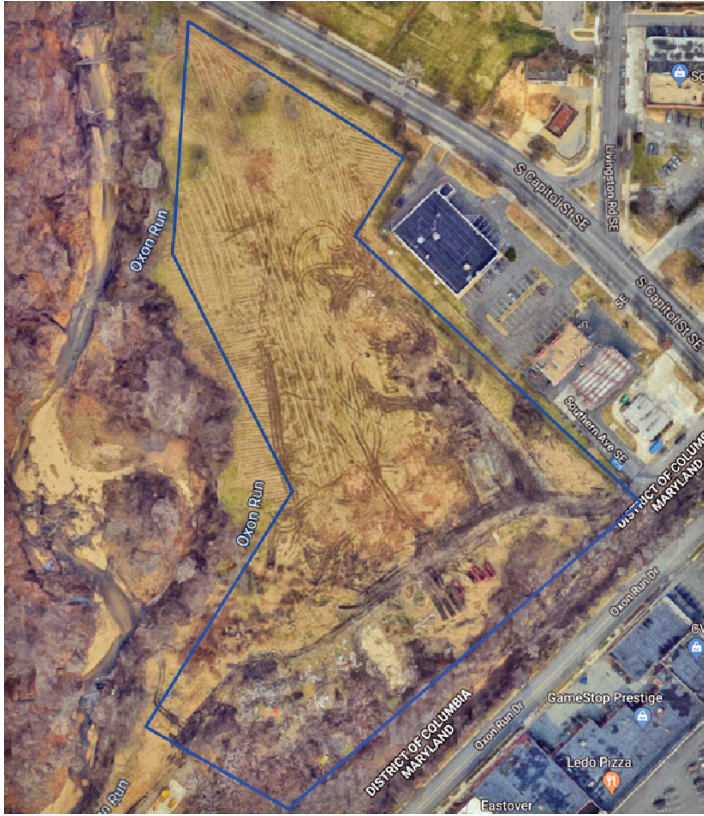




COMMUNITY SOLAR AT OXON RUN



Community Solar at Oxon Run will be the **largest clean energy project** in the District focused on serving neighborhood residents.

At least **750 households** will receive up to **\$500 per year** to reduce power bills in half.

This Oxon Run project is using an underutilized brownfield* site.

There are approximately **3.6 acres** of community solar panels.

Solar energy is safe, quiet, and clean.

It is one of the most community friendly ways to make electricity.

*A brownfield is a property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant.

NUMBER OF HOUSEHOLDS SERVED	Approximately 750 income eligible households.
AMOUNT OF BENEFITS PER YEAR	Approximately \$500 per household, sufficient to offset about 50% of electric utility bills.
LENGTH OF BENEFITS	15 to 25 years starting in late 2019.
JOBS BENEFITS	Local subcontractor hiring requirements and preference points.
HEALTH BENEFITS	Reduces air pollution and asthma by reducing electricity from fossil fuels.
ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS	30,000 metric tons of GHG emissions avoided, equivalent to removing more than 6,300 cars from the road for a year, or planting 777,000 tree seedlings grown for 10 years. Reuse a brownfield site contaminated with petroleum residues 17 - 25 feet below the surface (poses no danger to humans or animals if left in place).
COMMUNITY BENEFITS	The beneficiaries of the solar power will be Oxon Run community residents. DOEE is engaging the community to define eligibility. Landscaping enhancements include native and ornamental trees, shrubs, and wildflowers to beautify and restore wildlife habitat.
