Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (from EPA) Background

The Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG) program provides funding to States to develop ambitious plans for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and other harmful air pollution

- Phase 1: Planning This is where we are now
 - Priority Climate Action Plan: Due March, 2024
 - Comprehensive Climate Action Plan: Due Summer, 2025
- Phase 2: Implementation EPA has announced competitions for \$4.6 billion in CPRG implementation grants
 - Implementation grants will need to directly tie to PCAP



Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Background

- Engagement DOEE's responsibilities:
 - PCAP and CCAP should identify disadvantaged communities in the jurisdiction covered by the plan, meaningfully engage with such communities in the development of each plan and continue this engagement into the future.



Request for Applications – Project Overview

 DOEE seeks eligible entities to collect community feedback, understand community priorities, and continue to engage community members, especially low-income disadvantaged communities (LIDAC), around clean energy and climate change.

 This input will support the development of a federally-funded Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) and Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP) for the District of Columbia to address greenhouse gas emissions while benefitting local communities.

 The amount available for the project is \$125,000.

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Request for Applications – Project Overview Continued

 The grantee will be responsible for designing an engagement plan and conducting the planned engagement activities.

- Grantee will provide DOEE with an engagement plan for collecting community input
- The grantee will execute the plan.
- The grantee will summarize its experience and offer analysis and recommendations for DOEE

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Eligibility

- Non profit organizations
- Faith-based organizations
- Universities
- Private enterprises

•Government agencies are not eligible to apply

3	Presents a creative, comprehensive, cost-effective proposal for completion and execution of an engagement plan within the stated timeframe	25
4	Demonstrates experience working with historically under-represented, low income, and disadvantaged communities.	10
5	Demonstrates substantial technical level understanding and knowledge on climate change.	10
6	Demonstrates experience working with disadvantaged communities within the District.	5
7	Presents a detailed, reasonable, and cost-effective budget and budget narrative.	10
