### DC Sanitary Line Correction and Education Program

DOEE seeks eligible entities to conduct a pilot project using a participatory process to educate the targeted communities, in the Watts Branch and Nash Run watersheds (“Community/Communities”), on proper residential plumbing installation or renovation of sanitary lines. The grantee will also provide support to correct improperly installed lines. The grantee will document its work and develop a guidance report that DOEE will use to expand the program to serve more District residents in the targeted communities. The amount available for the project is \$180,000.
