

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)

- In the MS4 area of the city, stormwater flows over impervious surfaces, picking up pollutants; this pollutant-laden water enters the storm sewer and discharges directly into waterways.
- EPA issues an MS4 permit which authorizes these discharges so long as the District completes a variety of specific activities aimed at reducing stormwater pollution.





Purpose of MS4 Permit

Broad MS4 Permit Activities:

- Pollution Prevention
 (education/ outreach, good housekeeping)
- Pollution treatment/removal (stormwater BMPs, source reduction)
- Pollution monitoring (outfall, water quality sampling)






Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs)

BMPs retain stormwater to reduce runoff that causes erosion and carries pollutants to our rivers, streams, and wetlands. Examples of BMPs include:

- Green roofs,
- Rain gardens,
- Permeable pavement,
- Rain barrels,
- Tree plantings

RFA Overview

- Each applicant must apply through the Grants Management System (GMS). The application deadline is Tuesday, April 30, 2024, at 11:59 PM EST.
- RFA found on DOEE's website: https://doee.dc.gov/node/1716036
- \$90,600 available for anticipated period through September 2025.
- If EPA authorizes it, the period of performance could possibly be extended for additional time; depends on performance, funds, and need
- Eligible to apply:
 - Nonprofit organizations, including those with IRS 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) determinations
 - Faith-based organizations
 - Universities/educational institutions;
 - and -Private Enterprises.

Government agencies are ineligible.

Project Description

- 1. Conduct an inventory and analysis of past and current DOEE DEIJ efforts for MS4 permit programs.
- 2. Work with DOEE stormwater staff to develop recommendations.
- 3. Provide DOEE with a plan for meaningful engagement.
- 4. Meaningfully engage with relevant communities.
- 5. Produce the Strategy.

Given the multiple disciplines involved in this project, DOEE encourages an applicant to form a team consisting of multiple entities with a range of specialties.

Outputs and Deliverables

- 1. Number of meaningfully engaged residents
- 2. Number of DOEE MS4 permit program staff engaged
- 3. Number of DOEE MS4 programs with new DEIJ recommendations
- 4. Number of stakeholders engaged

- 6. Number of public engagement forums
- 7. Number of stakeholders who provide public comments

Deliverables

- 1. DEIJ Strategy document
- 2. Engagement Plan
- 3. Inventory, Analysis and Recommendation for past and current stormwater program DEIJ efforts
- 4. Copies of comments/feedback from the public and MS4 permit program staff
- 5. Evidence of public engagement (such as sign-in sheets, meeting minutes)
- 6. Quarterly progress reports
- 7. Final report
