

LINNEAN OUTFALL & GULLY RESTORATION

The District Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE), recently awarded a design-build contract to Biohabitats, Inc., to design and construct a gully restoration project at the end of Linnean Avenue NW in D.C. The gully extends from the end of Linnean Avenue NW to Soapstone Creek (see map on back) and had experienced excessive erosion from stormwater. The site will be restored to minimize erosion and improve the environmental health of the project area. Project work will also help improve water quality conditions in Rock Creek, the Potomac River, and the Chesapeake Bay.
