Job Summary

The mission of the Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE) is to protect and restore the environment, conserve natural resources, and improve the quality of life in the District of Columbia. As the nation's capital city, the District will become a model of environmental protection and sustainable environmental practices. In partnership with other District agencies, the federal government, business groups, non-profit organizations, and residents, the department will help instill environmental awareness through innovation and best practices.

This position is located in the Inspection and Enforcement Division (IED) of the Natural Resources Administration (NRA) in the Department of Energy and Environment. This position serves as the Branch Chief for the Construction Stormwater Branch, with responsibility for supervision of direct reports as well as managing the day-to-day operation of regulatory compliance programs that protect water quality. Staff in this branch are responsible for inspecting construction sites for compliance with District regulations pertaining to erosion and sediment control, stormwater management, and green area ratio requirements.

Duties and Responsibilities

The position oversees the issuance of enforcement actions for violations under District water quality regulations, including the District of Columbia Water Pollution Act of 1984 and District Stormwater Regulations. The position ensures that each program is implementing quality assurance measures and provides strategic direction to improve business processes and reporting functions.

Preferred Experience

Specialized Experience: Expert knowledge and experience in supervision, program planning, and evaluation techniques in order to direct, manage, and oversee a branch within the District Department of Energy and Environment; expert knowledge of applicable federal and District legislation, regulations, policies, and procedures; Expert knowledge of grant and contracting procedures to monitor program grants and contracts and to prepare grant applications, contracts, agreements, work plans, and reports; superior ability to communicate, both orally and in writing, to a variety of audiences, including local, state, regional, and federal agency officials; technical staff members; community groups; and individuals regarding the development of the District's water quality program.
