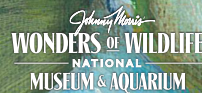

Winners are awarded in four age categories in every state:

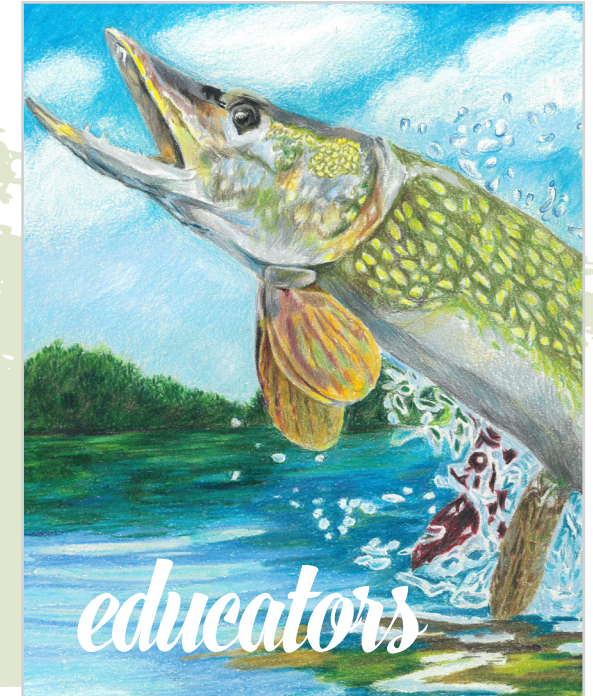
- Kindergarten-3rd
